

The World in View from a Believer's Perspective

For those of you who were not able to attend our summer ice-cream socials, it was there that I began sharing with the larger community of Holy Cross the idea of the *Stabat Mater Adoration Chapel & Outreach Center*: 'Stabat Mater' is the first line of the ancient hymn traditionally sung during Stations of the Cross:

Stabat mater dolorosa juxta Crucem lacrimósa, dum pendébat Fílius.

At the Cross her station keeping, stood the mournful Mother weeping, close to her Son to the last.

This idea was born of prayer and the possibilities of spiritual renewal for our Parish Community. Adoration, as we all know, is a Eucharistic devotion whereby members of a parish take hours of adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament solemnly exposed in a monstrance day and night throughout the week.

The typical benefits for a parish having perpetual adoration amount to this: an increase in Mass attendance and the reception of sacraments, a return of fallen-away Catholics and an increase in the number of conversions, the young find out and accept that they have religious vocations to the priesthood and religious life, a renewal of Catholic family life, and finally, but not least, parishioners experience greater desire and courage to spread the 'Good News' about Jesus with others. As for the parish as a whole, Jesus becomes more eagerly sought out in His Real Presence, i.e., the Blessed Sacrament.

Is this something we want to experience within the confines of our property at 1244 S. Power Rd? The upcoming surveys for the *Together Let Us Go Forth* Campaign which, I will be forwarding you shortly, will greatly help me and my closest collaborators discern if we should take this direction.

If you want to see more detailed plans of *Stabat Mater*, today, you'll find them on display, within the glass cases at the north of the Church, the north wall of Anderson Hall, and next to the door of the main office.

Stabat Mater's spirituality: A place of adoration and solitude where adorers of our community offer prayers specifically for the return of the fallen away and the conversion of sinners. Adoration would be held throughout the week until 3:00pm on Friday and then reposed to commemorate our Lord's passing and to help the adorer understand what the world is without its Savior present. This helps the adorer better grasp the peril of so many souls who are far from God. Adoration would resume on Sunday after the first mass. A niche on the façade of Stabat Mater holds a statue of our Blessed Mother whose hopeful gaze meets the cross on the bell tower of our Church. The Blessed Mother who was present at his passing already knew then that He would soon return to prove his triumph over sin and death. She is the model we need when dealing with those we love who may be far from God. The chapel is designed with six stained glass windows dedicated to saints who were notorious sinners before their own conversions.

Emergency Anointing of the Sick

If you or someone you know is in critical condition or near death, call (480)981-2021. After 5:00 pm and weekends, Press 4 when instructed to do so. Leave a detailed message, including a contact name and telephone number, that will be heard by the priest on call. Please do not use this service for any other reason.

Federal Privacy Regulation

HIPAA (Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act), prohibits all hospitals from informing churches of a patient's presence **unless the patient gives permission** for the hospital to do so. If you are admitted to a hospital and would like a member of the clergy or a caregiver to visit you, please notify the hospital or call the parish office.


THE TRINITY OF STEWARDSHIP

The Sowers would like the help of someone with a serger to serge the necks of the baptism bibs. This is a great ministry you can do on your own schedule and in the comfort of your own home!





Adrian's Story

When Adrian arrived at the Kino Border Initiative *comedor* in Sonora in May 2016 after living in the U.S. for 17 years -- just



During the 15 months that Adrian and his boys were separated, they had three joyful, supervised visits in Sonora. Finally, in August this year, through a new KBI legal services program, in spite of the formidable paperwork, administrative details, and several hearings, everything was approved for reunification of Adrian's family. A happy ending. Without representation by an attorney, 93% of migrants detained lose their case.

Imagine for a moment that was you. Or someone you love.

The Kino Border Initiative would give you compassion and support, and advocate for your rights, including humane treatment. The staff would listen to your story, believe in you, and offer you **hope**. This, the staff does 365 days a year, while meeting basic needs. Last year they served hot meals to 8,367 individuals, and sheltered 380 women and children. The men sleep on the street or at a cemetery.

Father Sean Carroll, S.J., and the Sisters of the Eucharist are grateful to Holy Cross Parishioners for your continuing prayers and generous humanitarian aid.



What is "right" and "wrong"? Is what's right for you

Or maybe we accept that there is a moral standard for all, but we don't know how to explain our moral convictions in a convincing way. Maybe some of us are afraid of saying something is immoral because we're afraid of offending others or of being labeled intolerant. How do we talk about morality in a relativistic world? Join us for an 8 week Adult Faith Formation study program featuring renown theologian. author, and national speaker, Dr. Edward Sri. We'll explore the classical view of morality and find that it's not merely a set of guiding principles for theoretical situations-it is an entire way of life.

To qualify for a \$300 quarter-year respite voucher, you must be a full-time family caregiver living with your care receiver. 

La historia de Adrián

Cuando Adrián llego al comedor de la Iniciativa Kino Border en Sonora en mayo de 2016, después de vivir en los Estados Unidos por 17 años – recién deportado, sin conocer a nadie, y con sus hijos, de 2 y 3 años detenidos en custodia del estado después que él fue arrestado – tanto su situación como sus posibilidades de reunirse con sus hijos parecían sin esperanza.

Al trabajar con el personal, en un plazo de tres semanas, Adrián, quien tenía custodia de sus niños anteriormente, ya había conseguido un trabajo en una *maquiladora*, había rentado un apartamento, y obtenido los documentos necesarios para proseguir con los esfuerzos de recuperar a sus hijos. Tomó clases de paternidad y arregló su vivienda para acomodar a los niños pequeños.

Durante los 15 meses que Adrián y sus hijos estuvieron separados, ellos tuvieron tres visitas supervisadas llenas de alegría en Sonora. Finalmente, en agosto de este año, por medio de un nuevo programa de servicios legales de la Iniciativa Kino Border, a pesar de la increíble cantidad de papeleo, de los mil detalles administrativos, y de varias audiencias, todo fue aprobado para la reunificación de la familia de Adrián. Un final feliz. Sin la representación de un abogado, el 93% de los migrantes detenidos pierden sus casos.

Imaginen por un momento que esa persona fuera uno de ustedes. O alguien a quien ustedes aman.

La Iniciativa Kino Border les daría compasión y apoyo, y abogaría por sus derechos, incluyendo un tratamiento humano. El personal escucharía su historia, creería en ustedes, y les ofrecería **esperanza**. El personal hace esto los 365 días del año, a la vez que cubren necesidades básicas. El año pasado sirvieron comidas calientes a 8,367 personas, albergaron a 380 mujeres y niños. Los hombres duermen en la calle o en un cementerio.

El Padre Sean Carroll, S.J. y las Hermanas de la Eucaristía están agradecidos con los feligreses de la Santa Cruz por sus continuas oraciones y por la generosa ayuda humanitaria que les han brindado.

Lo que más se necesita ahora: Pantalones para hombre, de 28 a 34 pulgadas de cintura; Zapatos tenis para hombre, en tamaño 8 al 9 y medio, y cosméticos en tamaño de viaje. Por favor traigan sus donativos al patio de la iglesia solamente antes de las Misas del fin de semana, el 13 y 14 de enero de 2018. Solamente esos dos dias.

Para aquellos de ustedes que no pudieron asistir a nuestras reuniones de verano en las que servimos helado, fue allí que yo comencé a compartir con toda la comunidad de la Santa Cruz la idea de la Capilla de Adoración & Centro de Proyección hacia la Comunidad Stabat Mater. 'Stabat Mater' es la primera línea en latín del antiguo himno que se canta tradicionalmente durante el Viacrucis:

Stabat mater dolorosa juxta Crucem lacrimósa, dum pendébat Fílius.

Estaba la Madre dolorosa Junto a la Cruz llorosa En que pendía su Hijo.

Esta idea nació de la oración y de las posibilidades de renovación espiritual para la comunidad de nuestra parroquia. Como todos sabemos, la Adoración es una devoción eucarística en la cual los miembros de una parroquia se turnan en horas de adoración ante el Santísimo Sacramento expuesto solemnemente en una custodia, día y noche, a lo largo de la semana.

Los beneficios típicos de que una parroquia tenga adoración perpetua son: un aumento en la asistencia a Misa y en la recepción de sacramentos; un retorno de católicos que se han alejado y un aumento en el número de conversiones; los jóvenes se enteran y aceptan que ellos tienen vocaciones religiosas para el sacerdocio y la vida religiosa; una renovación de la vida familiar católica; y, finalmente, aunque no menos importante, los feligreses sienten un mayor deseo y más valentía para diseminar la 'Buena Nueva' acerca de Jesús con otras personas. En cuanto a la parroquia en general, hay una búsqueda más ansiosa de Jesús en Su Presencia Real, como es el Santísimo Sacramento.

¿Es esto algo que nosotros quisiéramos experimentar dentro de los confines de nuestra propiedad en el 1244 S. de Power Road? Las próximas encuestas para la campaña *Juntos Sigamos Adelante*, las cuales les estaré enviando dentro de poco, me ayudarán a mí y a mis colaboradores cercanos a discernir si esa es la dirección que deberíamos tomar.

Si ustedes quieren ver planes más detallados de *Stabat Mater*, hoy los podrán encontrar en exhibición dentro de las cajas de vidrio al norte de la iglesia, sobre la pared norte del Salón Anderson, y al lado de la puerta hacia la oficina principal.

sería durante la semana hasta las 3:00 pm los viernes y luego se pondría en reposo el Santísimo para conmemorar la muerte de nuestro Señor y para ayudar a los adoradores a entender lo que sería el mundo sin la presencia de su Salvador. Esto ayuda al adorador a comprender mejor el peligro de tantas almas que están lejos de Dios. La Adoración se reanudaría el domingo después de la primera misa. Un nicho en la fachada de la capilla Stabat Mater tiene una estatua de nuestra Santísima Madre, cuya mirada llena de esperanza se dirige a la cruz que está en la torre del campanario de nuestra iglesia. La Santísima Madre que estuvo presente durante la muerte de su hijo, ya sabía desde entonces que Él regresaría pronto para comprobar su triunfo sobre el pecado y la muerte. Ella es el modelo que necesitamos cuando tratamos con nuestros seres queridos que puedan haberse alejado de Dios. La capilla está diseñada con seis ventanas de vidrio de colores dedicadas a santos que fueron pecadores notorios antes de su conversión.
